

## WCPW Milling Material – Right of Entry

I, the undersigned, do hereby grant to the Whitfield County Public Works Department, or its authorized agents, the right to enter and dump millings on my property located in Whitfield County, at:

The site must be inspected and approved by Whitfield County Public Works. Inspections will occur several weeks before a milling project begins. Forms may be filled out at any time and are kept on file indefinitely, however, forms submitted 30 days prior may not be considered for an upcoming project. The site must be clearly marked on the ground. Not all sites will be approved. There will be no charge for the milled material or the delivery from WCPW. No other contract with the material is permitted by a WCPW employees or equipment. (NO SPREADING OR GRADING)

**Only residents of Whitfield County are eligible. Millings delivered to Whitfield County residents are intended for their personal use only. The above signed may not sell, trade or barter the millings for personal gain. Contract haulers may be used in lieu of public works trucks; however, they must guarantee that millings are delivered to Whitfield County residents. Any monetary exchange between a resident and a contractor will be for the delivery fee and/or additional work on site. Only commercially licensed tandem dump trucks will be loaded. Material will be allocated based on availability, proximity to the work site and the number of request. No set number of loads are to be expected.**

## Whitfield County Public Works (WCPW) - Asphalt Milling Facts:

Asphalt Millings are ground up asphalt that are removed from selected county roads prior to paving.  
[Not all county roads are milled.](#)

### 1. A “Right of Entry” or “Milling Request” form is required first.

- a. Right of Entry form may be filled out at any time; however, it will typically not be considered if it is filled out within 30 days of the milling project. Milling request are kept on file indefinitely and reviewed when a project is near your property. Forms are on the WCPW webpage, can be faxed (706-278-2165) or emailed, or come by WCPW located at 170 Gillespie Drive, 8 am until 3 pm. For questions, call the office at 706-278-7167.

### 2. Site Inspections:

- a. Sites are not inspected immediately. Your site will be inspected when WCPW is working within a few miles of your property. This may take years. Typically, you will receive a phone call to insure the request is still valid and to let you know that a representative will be out to inspect the site.
- b. Request stay in our system indefinitely
- c. A site inspection is not a guarantee for delivery. It is to insure that a county dump truck can enter the property without causing damage to your property or the county truck. (Examples: low tree limbs, power lines, gate widths, locked gates, muddy areas, field lines etc.)
- d. Once a site has been approved, it will be marked with survey ribbon or flags at the dump location and near your driveway.

### 3. Expectations after your inspection:

- a. WCPW has to inspect more sites than we probably will use, to insure that we can get rid of all of the millings and not delay the oncoming paving project. **Not every site inspected will receive millings.**
- b. Typically, sites are selected within a 2-mile radius of the project
- c. WCPW employees will not open gates or make phone calls just prior to a delivery. Property must be accessible due to schedule changes
- d. WCPW can estimate the number of loads but several factors impact:
  - i. About 70 loads of millings are generated per mile
  - ii. Not all roads are milled the same, some may produce less
  - iii. Contractors may haul more loads on some projects than others
  - iv. WCPW trucks haul about 60% of the millings
  - v. Some areas have more request than others, this is why you may not get as many loads as you want
  - vi. WCPW may use some or all of the millings for other county projects
